

Chronology (using footnote dates)

- 200 A group led by Zeniff leaves Zarahemla to go to the land of Nephi where they make a treaty with the Lamanite king and move into two cities, Lehi-Nephi and Shilom
- 187 Initial battles between Lamanites and Zeniff's people
- 178 King Laman dies; his son attacks Zeniff's people again
- 150 Abinadi teaches the people the first time
- 148 Abinadi teaches the people the second time, is arrested and testifies before Noah and his priests

Alma is converted and flees into the wilderness with some followers

- 147 Alma and his people number about 450, live in Mormon
- 145 Alma and his people, warned by the Lord, leave Mormon and go to a new land they call Helam
 - Gideon tries to kill Noah; Lamanites attack and Noah and the priests flee (eventually to the city Amulon); Noah's son Limhi is made king and pays tribute to the Lamanites to stop the battles
- 130 Amulon (one of Noah's priests) and his people are discovered by some lost Lamanites and join together; they find Alma and his people in Helam and put them in bondage
- 124 Benjamin's address to the people


